SUDA, Uttar Pradesh, Organises a Workshop for District Officials and City Mission Managers

To enhance the competencies of the mission staff, the State Urban Development Agency (SUDA), Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, organised a three-day capacity-building programme. Dr Anil Kumar, State Mission Director, DAY-NULM, emphasised the importance of understanding the intricacies of various portals in his address. During the sessions, attendees were educated on NULM MIS, PAiSA and PM SVANidhi portals. MoHUA NIC Technical director, national mission manager, representative of Indian Bank and technical team of SIDBI resolved the queries of the

participants through video conferencing. More than 120 participants, including project officers and CMMs from 75 districts, attended the training. The training provided practical insights and knowledge to the participants, fostering a better understanding of the portals.



ADUDA, Arunachal Pradesh Organises EDP Training in Mushroom Farming & Pickle Making

Additional District Urban Development Agency (ADUDA), Pangin, Arunachal Pradesh, organised training on mushroom farming and pickle making, under the Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP). The initiative, in collaboration with the Siang Valley Multipurpose Cooperative Society and the Horticulture Department, was organised to empower urban self-help group women and enhance their livelihoods. During the training, 45 women participated, and they were trained with skills and

knowledge to establish their mushroom farming and picklemaking businesses, thereby fostering entrepreneurship and sustainable livelihoods in the locality.

In addition to vending their products at market stalls, they are actively raising awareness for a safer environment. This venture not only fulfils the rising demand for herbal colours but also offers SHG women a pathway to economic empowerment.



From Struggles to Success: Sewali Kalita's Journey with PM SVA Nidhi

Sewali Kalita, hailing from Assam, faced dire circumstances during the COVID-19 pandemic while operating her stall in Noonmati, Guwahati. Struggling to make ends meet, she resorted to borrowing money from neighbours until she learned about PM SVANidhi through the Guwahati Municipal Corporation. With her first loan of INR 10,000, she ventured into selling organic vegetables and expanded her business by running a pan shop concurrently. Prompt loan repayment earned her an additional loan of INR 20,000, empowering her to establish another organic vegetable stall. With a subsequent loan of INR 50,000, she diversified her offerings and increased her stock. Sewali's thriving vegetable stall has provided her family with much-needed financial stability, exemplifying the transformative impact of PM SVANidhi.
